TRANSPORTATION

Medicaid Cab Transportation

If a patient is under a Managed Care Plan through Medicaid (meaning they have CareSource, Molina, Buckeye, Paramount or United Healthcare) they are eligible for 15 free round trip cab rides to and from their doctor, WIC or Medicaid redetermination appointments. On the Medicaid card, look for the Member Services or Transportation phone number to schedule. Medicaid will also send bus passes instead of cabs if desired by the patient. Try to give as much notice as possible if transportation services are needed.

COTA-Bus Transportation

\$62 unlimited monthly bus pass or a \$4.50 unlimited day pass. COTA also offers a 50% discount to riders 65 and older, disabled, Medicare card or VA disability minimum of 80%. For more information call 614-228-1776.

TRANSPORTATION ASSISTANCE



If you're covered by Medicaid and you're having trouble getting to health care services, transportation assistance may be available.

- If you're not a plan member (or you want an option besides what your plan offers), contact the Medicaid Transportation Coordinator at your local county department of job and family services (CDJFS). **Remind patients to save a copy of their application including their confirmation number and the date/time it was submitted as proof.

DENTAL CARE

Medicaid

If a patient is enrolled in Medicaid and has a Managed Care Plan "MCP" (meaning their provider is either CareSource, Molina, United Healthcare, Buckeye or Paramount) they should have dental coverage. The key is finding providers who accept the MCP. This can be done through each MCP's individual website; you can narrow down your search by zip code and by type of service desired.

Medicare

Basic Medicare typically does not cover dental services unless the patient is enrolled in a supplemental plan. OSHIP has a wonderful hotline dedicated to helping people with Medicare understand their coverage at 1-800-686-1578.
